SHANE CASEY WRITER /PERFORMER

Shane Casey is best known for his role as Billy Murphy in the BBC TV series 'The Young Offenders'. Shane has also appeared in numerous television shows and films including the Palm d'Or winning 'The Wind that Shakes the Barley' alongside Cillian Murphy and directed by Ken Loach, 'I Never Cry' a Polish/Irish production released at the 2020 San Sebastian Film Festival and winner at the Dublin International Film Festival 2021, Channel 5's 'Intruder' and, most recently, 'The Beautiful Game' currently streaming on Netflix. Casey also picked up best actor awards for his role as Doc in the Mark Cogan 'Home' trilogy. His theatre credits include the acclaimed original production of 'Love, Peace and Robbery', for which Casey won best actor at the Underground Film Awards, and Frank O'Connor's 'God Bless the Child'. His work as a writer has produced the show 'Wet Paint', among other productions, which achieved great success in Cork Opera House in 2019, followed by a national tour. 'Wet Paint' looks at male relationships on a building site and is based on Casey's deep understanding and time working as a painter and decorator. His radio play, 'The Man Who Talks to Statues', went to air on Newstalk Radio in 2023 and is currently available on the Drama on Newstalk Spotify channel. Shane can be seen next in Season 4 of 'The Young Offenders' premiering on BBC1 on 10th May 2024.

BRIAN DESMOND DIRECTOR

Brian is a theatre director, dramaturge and playwright. He has directed over thirty plays, mainly new work for the Irish stage. His work has toured Ireland, the UK and the US. He specialises in directing solo shows, storytelling theatre and comedy. Credits for Be Your Own Banana Theatre Company (BYOB) include "De Bogman", "The Ballad of Badger Bickle's Youngfella", "Raccoon" and "Thailand: What's Love Got To Do With It?". Other directing credits include "Love, Peace and Robbery", "There are Little Kingdoms" (Meridian), "Mr Kolpert" and "Frank Pig Says Hello" (Granary). As dramaturge, he has helped develop work with a number of companies internationally, including Teatro Pomodoro, Fright Wig and The Colonial B***ards. Brian has trained at the prestigious École Philippe Gaulier in France. He has also trained with numerous internationally recognised practitioners in the area of clown and comedy, including Aitor Basauri (Spymonkey), Pegasus Theatre (Germany), Actors Space (Spain), John Wright (Trestle), Jon Davison (UK), Jamie Wood (UK), Teatro Pomodoro (Liverpoolbased Clown Collective), Yoel Ogilvy (France), Carlo Jacucci (Italy), Ronlin Foreman (Dell'Arte School), amongst others.

CORMAC O'CONNOR SOUND & VIDEO DESIGN

As a Sound and Video Designer Cormac has designed over 120 Theatre productions in Ireland and the U.K. He was the original Sound Designer on Corcadorca's Disco Pigs which toured to international acclaim in the 1990s, written by Enda Walsh and starring Cillian Murphy and Eileen Walsh. Career highlights include Demon Juice at the Royal Opera House London 2007. The Enchanted Room, a sound installation at Royal Festival Hall 2002 The straits, a Herald Angel award winner for Paine's Plough at the Edinburgh Festival 2003. Push at the Almedia and Sadler's Wells Theatre, London 2004, Directing and Sound Design for Shostakovitch Royal Festival Hall 2013, Finding Mrs Havisham 2020. There Will Be No Silence (David Downes) 2021 About Blank (Adam Wyeth) 2021. Cormac has collaborated with Grafitti Theatre Company on 18 Theatre productions for young people. He has composed the music for 4 documentaries by Pat Collins. He created Sound Design and Projection mapping on Glow for Cork city Councils Christmas shows 2013, 2017, 2019 and 2020.
